### Notes and Limits on Electives:

One elective course at the 300 level may come from outside of the Economics Department with the advisor's approval if the course is closely related to economics.

Only two of ECON-370, ECON-371, and ECON-372 (international econ courses) may be counted towards the major.

Only two of ECON-361, ECON-362 and ECON-363 (economic development courses) may be counted towards the major.

Up to two electives may be fulfilled by the Washington Economic Policy Semester courses.

Up to two economics courses from study abroad programs may be counted towards the major. If one is used to fulfill the core requirement, one may be counted as an elective.

Up to 3 credit hours of independent reading and independent study courses and internships may be counted as electives.

Students in the International Track or the BS program may not take ECON-370 for major credit.
